WHEREAS Council received an application for an 18-unit apartment building to be built on approved Lot 17-1 on the TransCanada Highway, and the proposed building would be above the maximum height of 35'ft; and

WHEREAS Council can grant a Height Restriction Exemption if the proposed development meets the requirements found in section 4.6(2) of the Zoning and Subdivision Control Bylaw; and

WHEREAS Council considered the Town's Official Plan and the Town of Cornwall Zoning and Subdivision Control (Development) Bylaw #414 particularly section 4.6(2), dealing with such development; and

WHEREAS Council deemed the Building is compatible with surrounding development in terms of architectural design, building materials, building massing, building form, and streetscape;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council grant approval for a Height Restriction Exemption in order to allow the proposed apartment building to be built on Lot 17-1 on the TransCanada Highway. CARRIED

3. PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE - Councillor Shane McGuigan

Councillor McGuigan noted that the Committee met on June 13, 2017.

Councillor McGuigan noted staff have completed installation of 15 speed humps with enough sections left over for 2 more streets, however, more end caps are needed. The Committee would like to install speed humps on Lowther Drive, 2nd on MacArthur Drive, Marianne Drive, Wilfred Drive, Queens Road, and Karen Drive. Staff are working on getting the approval for the additional speed humps from TIE before ordering additional speed humps. If approved staff will order four full sets of speed humps and two additional sets of end caps to use the left-over sections.

Councillor McGuigan noted staff has been advised by TIE, they will remove the culvert and driveway entrance to Seymour Drive at the Civic Centre at no cost. Parks and Recreation has agreed to build a foot bridge to be installed after the culvert is removed.

Councillor McGuigan noted the 50+ Group is considering moving from the Civic Centre to a meeting room at the Town Hall providing access to kitchenette is available. The Committee wants further information as to the agreement with the 50+ Group before proceeding with the renovation.
