  - ii) EV Charger Rate Options – Council reviewed the recommendations by Maritime Electric regarding the charging rates; and after a lengthy discussion, it was moved by Councillor Barnes and seconded by Councillor MacIsaac to bring forward a resolution to council to implement an hourly rate fixed at \$2.19 per charging hour for all EV Charger sites except those at Town Hall, which would be fixed at \$1.97 per charging hour.
